MY NEW FAVORITE TOOL FOR SPLITTING BAMBOO - BY DAVE TUTTLE


Hello BCKA er's.

I purchased a new kite related tool recently that I thought members may be interested in. I have worked with bamboo over the years for kites with mixed success. I have used various tools to split the bamboo with: buck knife, machete, hatchet, chef's knife etc., and none of those work well.

I have a small bamboo splitter that I got from Dan Kurahashi which he produced for one of his Fort Worden workshops and it works well for very small bamboo. But for larger bamboo you need something with a thicker back and none of the tools mentioned are thick enough and have the right amount of taper to the blade. Consequently I do not use a lot of bamboo for kites. I would like to but the incorrect tools are limiting as is my skill level.

I recently made a paper kite skin that I really wanted to use bamboo with and so decided to look online for the proper splitting tool. I searched and found a place called **Hida Tools**. They sell Japanese woodworking and garden tools of all types and they had something called a Bamboo Hatchet. Item # N3604 \$49.90 US. It has a 6 3/4" long blade which is 1 1/2" wide and 3/16" thick at the back. This model has a 6" Oak handle although there is a slightly cheaper version with a steel handle only (N3605 \$46.90 US). This was exactly what I have wanted for a long time so I decided to bite the bullet and buy one. With exchange and shipping it cost me about \$80.00. I was very pleased when I received the tool. The finish quality on the tool is beautiful with black on the top of the blade and the blonde oak handle (see the two accompanying pictures). It feels well balanced in the hand and is comfortable to use. I have not used it a lot yet but when I have it makes splitting bamboo much easier.

It was always hard to get the bamboo to split into two equal pieces lengthwise. With this tool the bamboo practically splits its self with minimal effort on my part. The thickness of the blade and the sharpness are just right. Splitting the bamboo to the right thickness has always been very difficult as well, using buck knives or utility knives. Again, this tool makes that task effortless and the whole procedure much more enjoyable with better results. For kite makers who like to work with bamboo, experienced or beginner, I would highly recommend this item. Check out www.hidatool.com and look for Bamboo Hatchet N3604 or N3605. I spoke to them on the phone and they are very friendly and helpful. The only thing is that Canadian orders must be made by phone, at which point they send you a PayPal invoice by e-mail. I had the hatchet within two weeks. I hope some people find this useful.
